Aims and scope

The Alpine Workshop is held every two years to promote interdisciplinary research on the Alps and Alpine-type orogens.

This year marks 100 years since the publication of "La Tectonique de l'Asie" (September 1924) by Émile Argand (1879-1940), to whom this conference is officially dedicated. In the wake traced by the celebrated Swiss geologist, who emphasized the potential of geometric and kinematic analyses at regional scales integrated with stratigraphic, paleontological, and geophysical data, the conference aims to promote the discussion of new data and interpretations on the evolution of the Alps, the Apennines and adjacent peri-Mediterranean orogens. The meeting will be held in an informal and friendly atmosphere that will bring together senior researchers with young and early careers scientists.

Provisional Programme

The Alpine Workshop 2024 will be run only as an on-site event, no on-line presentation or streaming of sessions will be provided. As tradition from past Alpine Workshop and to have a meeting with a simple and informal organization, no overlapping session will be scheduled.

We solicit contributions to the thematic sessions below, all of which are interdisciplinary, hence open to the full breadth of Geosciences.

- Session T1 Pre-Alpine heritage in the Tethyan realm, Mesozoic continental rifting and spreading. Evidence from the Alps, Apennines, and peri-Mediterranean orogenic systems
- Session T2 Subduction, collision and basin dynamics in the Alps, Apennines and peri-Mediterranean chains
- Session T3 Imaging Alpine orogenic systems in the Mediterranean area from Surface to the Mantle (AlpArray, 4DMB and AdriaArray)
- Session T4 Dynamic interactions between mountain building, surface processes and climate in the Alpine-Mediterranean region
- Session T5 Active tectonics and seismic hazard in Alpine-Mediterranean region

Location

The conference is hosted by the University of Siena, one of the oldest universities in Italy.

Siena is one of the most beautiful city in Italy and one of the best preserved medieval towns, located in the heart of Tuscany (central Italy), 75 km south of Florence.
